SUBJECT: NORTH WALES COMMUNITY SAFETY PLAN

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To present some initial proposals to aid the production and development of a North Wales Community Safety Plan.

1.2 To seek the views and agreement of members regarding the proposed structure and outcomes of the plan.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 At the last meeting of the Safer Communities Board, held on 4th February 2013, it was agreed that a North Wales Community Safety Plan should be produced. Lee Robinson and Siân Jones were tasked to undertake the co-ordination of this body of work.
- 2.2 It will fulfil the statutory requirement for the region's Community Safety Partnerships to produce a Community Safety Plan. The document will also reflect the recommendations contained within the regional Strategic Assessment.
- 2.3 There will be an expectation that local and sub-regional arrangements will be in place to deliver operational needs, and also address any specific needs that arise from time to time.
- 2.4 The table below outlines a proposed timeline of activity for the production of the Plan, which is subject to change and amendment:

- 2.5 Reference to some key national drivers and strategies will be expected to be incorporated within the regional plan. Appendix 1 outlines some of the main priorities and drivers that currently impact the work of CSP's. It is not expected that the Plan will incorporate all aspects into its delivery, however it is important to recognise these drivers and have a clear rationale as to what can and cannot be incorporated within the final document. Consideration has been given to the following:
 - Crime and Disorder Act 1998
 - Home Office driven responsibilities
 - Welsh Government driven responsibilities
 - WECTU driven priorities
 - Priorities 2013 Strategic Assessment
 - Police and Crime Plan
- 2.6 Appendix 2 contains the priorities and outcomes from the region's Local Service Boards (LSB's) that relate to community safety. For the Plan to be a representative it is important that it reflects these ambitions.
- 2.7 Much of the needs assessment has already been undertaken through the exercises undertaken by LSB's, the Strategic Assessment (which

will be refreshed in October 2013) and the work that is currently ongoing to inform the substance misuse Commissioning Strategy.

3. CONSIDERATIONS

3.1 The table below outlines the proposed headings for the Plan. The intention will be to keep the document as concise and user friendly as possible.

3.2 The focal point of the Plan will be its purpose and outcomes. The table overleaf contains draft outcomes for members' consideration. They have been identified based on the revised Strategic Assessment (January 2013) and the key drivers for community safety emanating from the Home Office and Welsh Government. Whilst the evidence base for 'Prevent' does not appear in the Strategic Assessment, given the potential risk its inclusion in the Plan could be justified.

Upon agreement of the outcomes for the Plan, the focus will turn to identifying which measures can be used to track progress.

3.3 To take account of local and sub-regional differences, and reporting structures (such as LSB's), there will continue to be an expectation for responsibilities to be discharged locally. However, it is proposed that by agreeing common aims and outcomes progress will be tracked at a regional level. In time this will enable the SCB to identify where support is needed, and if necessary the deployment of additional resources. This approach supports the principle of regional commissioning.

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3.4 In terms of governance, there are already fora in existence on a North Wales basis that could be formally linked into the SCB to oversee work programmes. The North Wales Sexual Violence and Domestic Abuse Forum and the Area Planning Board are two good examples that currently oversee regional work that could be mandated to report to the SCB.
